Camp is coming — ARE YOU READY???

Now is the time to start planning your summer and we hope it includes CHURCH CAMP! There are so many wonderful opportunities for kids to have an amazing experience getting to know others and God in a variety of ways. Check out <https://sites.google.com/view/wdcamping/home> to get more information and to register.

This year, you can choose from:

- FAMILY CAMP offered June 2nd - 4th, designed for families of all varieties to have fun and relax, away from the everyday stress of life.
- CHETEK CAMP runs July 14 - 20th and is for kids who completed 9th grade through age 21. This is a weeklong camp where kids will experience dancing, silly themes, hammock village, high ropes, worship, campfires and more, all guided by faithful adults providing a memorable experience of God.
- WINMOR CAMP runs July 21 - 27th and is for kids who completed 6th through 8th grades. This amazing middle school youth experience combines sports, arts, creativity and fun to make God come alive in new and exciting ways.
- The last camp is JUNIOR CAMP running July 28th - Aug 1st and invites kids who completed 2nd through 5th grades to have a unique and supervised experience exploring where God leads them in nature and more.

Each of these camps is designed to spark interest in faith, develop questions and see how God is not far away, but nearby as a friend, help, support, and guide. Kids who attend camp experience faith in a new way, often returning with a zest for faith and a ton of new friends. To make sure each kid has the opportunity to go to camp, Ebenezer pays the tuition!!!

Here's how it works....go to the website. Click on the "register" tab under the correct camp for your child(ren). A \$50 deposit is due upon registering. Some families choose to pay this, that is a option. Another option is to pay and ask the church for reimbursement. The third option is to talk to Pastor Katie and register your child at church, allowing the church to cover the registration fee. No matter what you choose to do with the registration, please email Pastor Katie at pastor.kvdl@gmail.com and let her know about the registrations. We need to keep a record of all those registered so that we can send Mt. Morris the funds for each of our kids. Please know, we cover not only our kids, but also their friends. So please talk to Pastor Katie about getting registered and encourage your child to bring a friend to camp. We want every kid to have a church camp experience. So please, register your kid(s) and their friend(s) and talk to Pastor Katie about the registration fee and camp tuition.

We can also arrange carpools if necessary for camp. So please let Pastor Katie know who is going to camp and who may need a ride to/from camp. We are excited to make sure every kid has a memorable summer that includes CHURCH CAMP!

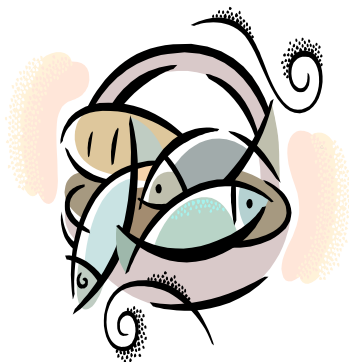

We have missed visiting with our dinner guests! As our mission states, we feed mind, body and spirit and that's been hard to do through a car window.

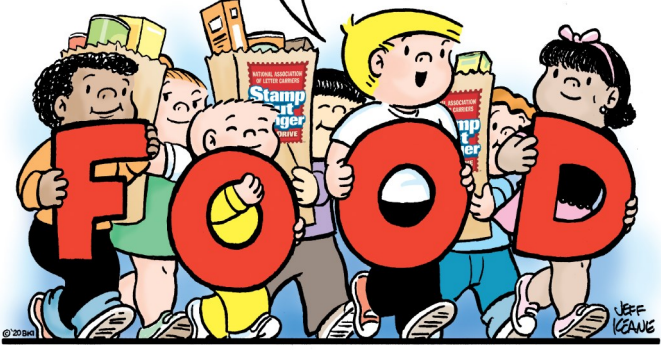
We are looking forward to a smooth transition back inside and will be happy to see each and every one of you!

BLESSING BOX

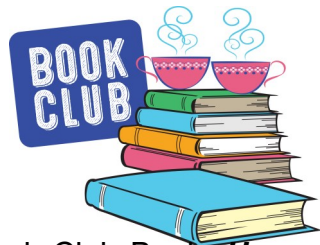
The Blessing Box is in need of donations of per-

Welcoming Watertown seeks info the homeless population....

At our last meeting, the welcoming Watertown group chose the focus of a "warming shelter" for the next few months. 50 people gathered to discuss possible issues in our community that we could assist with, and 12 people wished to work on the possible need for a warming shelter by next Winter. The task force is currently gathering information from various agencies and sources to discover if there is a need and what that would look like.

Our next meeting is Sunday May 5th at 12:30 to come together and share what is needed in the community and what that might look like. If you are interested in being part of this ministry, please let Pastor Katie know and she can give you more information.

This is just the issue chosen for now, as several important ones were discussed. As time goes, the group will choose different supports needed in the community. It is easier to help one at a time, than try to solve it all.

Please reach out to Pastor Katie if this is an issue and ministry you care about and want to be part of. Currently, the Watertown community has no drop-in shelter and many homeless are left to find areas on their own to stay warm in the Winter. What if there was a central location or church spaces for people to rest and stay warm over the winter months?
